- refer to a student's preferred ways of processing what is to be learned.
- include learning styles as well as intelligence and environmental preferences.

ENVIRONMENTAL PREFERENCES

Some of us prefer silence when working; others prefer sound. Some prefer an organized, brightly lit environment; some prefer a casual corner with subdued lighting.

Some preferences to consider include:

working away from others ↔ working alongside others

structured workspace ↔ casual workspace
(e.g. chair, table) (soft chair, clipboard)

light, bright setting ↔ subdued setting

quiet setting ↔ music or other background sounds
